On 6 February 2007 the Convention was opened for signature in Paris. We were pleased to see that Cyprus was one of the countries to sign at that time. So far 81 countries have signed the Convention and 10 countries have ratified.

We welcome the positive attitude of the Cypriot government towards the Convention. However, we notice the lapse of more than two years since its signature with no further developments. Its paramount importance for Cyprus can hardly be overstated. Cyprus has long suffered from this practice with many disappearances of Cypriot citizens still being unresolved.

We have already communicated our concern with the fact that Cyprus has not yet taken effective steps towards ratification by addressing the competent Minister, Mr Loucas Louca.



We would therefore urge you to promote the preparation of a ratifying law to the House of Representatives as a top priority of the Law Office of the Republic. The Convention will enter into force after 20 ratifications. Until today, 17 States have ratified it. By taking action without hesitation, Cyprus would be distinguished among the first countries to ratify the Convention and would therefore be instrumental to its entry into force.

Your Excellency,

The new Convention provides, inter alia, for the right to truth of the victims and of their relatives. Although the Convention does not have a retroactive effect, ratifying the Convention would send a strong, symbolical message that the State is endorsing its citizens' claim to have the fate of their loved ones ascertained.

- Adjust legislation to all the provisions of the Convention.
